The students at the manistique Middle and High School have a diverse choice of educational opportunities. All students have access to advanced placement courses, dual enrollment, virtual and traditional classes as well as a wide variety of vocational choices. Students are supported through the middle school and into the high school with the Multi-Tiered System of Support and special education classes. Finally, the Manistique Middle and High School offers a wide variety of fine arts offerings. Data disaggregation indicates that the group in need of the most academic support is economically disadvantaged males. Mathematics is currently an area that is receiving attention through professional development. Key initiatives include the use of MTSS and district wide curriculum realignment.

PROCESS FOR ASSIGNING PUPILS TO THE SCHOOL

The Manistique Middle and High School is the sole LEA within the Manistique Area School district. When students move into our district, parents/guardians complete an enrollment packet. Once the enrollment information has been received by school officials, the counselor/principal work with student/family to decide on courses that best suit the individual needs of the student.

THE STATUS OF THE 3-5 YEAR SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT PLAN

The faculty and staff of the Manistique Middle and High School are continuously revising and updating our School Improvement Plan. Our current plan expires in 2020.

A BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF EACH SPECIALIZED SCHOOL

The Middle and High School partners with the Delta-Schoolcraft Intermediate School District's Learning Center located at 2203 Seventh Avenue South in Escanaba, MI. This center provides educational programs and services to students with handicaps who reside in the Manistique Area Schools district. Classroom programs through the Learning Center include pre-primary impaired, autistic impaired, trainable mentally impaired and severely mentally impaired. Additional partnerships with the DSISD include a vocational education center located in the Middle and High School. All students have access to Computer Aided Drafting, Automotive Repair, Building Trades and Health Occupations.

Parent-Teacher Conferences were held once at the Manistique Middle and HS during the 2015/16 school year. The rate of attendance was 46%.

ADDITIONAL REPORTING:

The number of dual enrolled students was 22, of these students 22 earned college credit. Finally, there were 3 AP courses offered during the 2015/16 school year. We are proud of the fact that we are once again rated as 'lime' on the school report card. We have moved up on the 'top to bottom' list from the 33rd percentile to the 48th percentile on the top to bottom list.
